Fr Clement has asked me to forward you this urgent message from Right to Life regarding the *Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill*. [Also called the Assisted Suicide Bill or the assisted Dying Bill.]

As you will read, some of those who voted for the bill are now having doubts, and there is still a chance to stop the bill. The third reading and final vote are this coming Friday, 20th June, so there is no time to lose in contacting our MP's one final time.

Although the Right to Life message below specifically refers to Heeley, people in Hallam Constituency are also encouraged to contact their MP, Olivia Blake, who also voted for the bill at its second reading.

Petition forms will be available to sign at Masses this weekend, but it would be simpler and quicker, for those who are able, to use the email link to Right to Life below to sign electronically. I have just tried it out and successfully signed.

Petition your MP - Vote NO to the Assisted Suicide Bill

The second day of Report Stage for the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill has just finished.

Today, Kim Leadbeater suffered her first defeat - with MPs voting 259 to 216 to pass an amendment, which the Leadbeater camp were opposing, to stop doctors raising assisted suicide with under-18s.

This is a major setback for the assisted suicide lobby, but we are not there yet.

We now face Third Reading and the final vote on Kim Leadbeater's assisted suicide Bill next Friday, which is only seven days away.

Sheffield Heeley, could tip the balance and help stop this dangerous Bill in its tracks.

While the local MP, Louise Haigh, voted for assisted suicide at the initial vote at Second Reading, just 28 MPs needed to change their minds after Second Reading to defeat this Bill - and a number of MPs already have. That means this is winnable - but only if people like you take action in your constituency.

If enough people in Sheffield Heeley sign the local petition we are running in your constituency, it will be very persuasive in getting Louise Haigh to change their vote from supporting assisted suicide to voting NO or abstaining when it really matters - at the crucial final vote on the Bill next Friday, 20 June.

In fact, Louise Haigh could cast the deciding vote on the Leadbeater assisted suicide Bill. Every single vote will count. The numbers are tight, and the stakes couldn't be higher.
