Supporting our Parish Outreach partners this autumn

Our parish Outreach initiative – established in 1974 - supports projects helping people in need, in Sheffield and around the world, through the work of our Outreach partner organisations.

Our Outreach partners are largely organisations with which members of the parish have - or have had - some connection either personally or through family or friends. Our partners help raise our awareness, pray for us and give us the opportunity to put our faith into action. Details of our current Outreach partners are in the centre pages of this leaflet.

In the nearly five years since the start of 2017, the parish has raised and distributed £30, 360 to support the work of our Outreach partners. (Not to mention gifts donated in kind in our themed collections in Lent and Advent and the once-a-month food collections for St Wilfrid's Centre and Grace Food Bank.)

The necessary restrictions on public gatherings during the Covid pandemic have limited the opportunities for fundraising since spring 2019. But the Outreach group has been meeting regularly by Zoom, and donations have continued to come in and be distributed to our partners during the past 18 months.

The restrictions have been steadily reduced in recent months, but with the future trajectory of Covid still uncertain as winter approaches, the Outreach group decided against holding a parish raffle, our traditional autumn fundraising event. Instead we are launching a pre-Christmas appeal, running from mid-October (now) to late November. Details are on the back page of this leaflet and will also be in the weekly newsletter.

Our Current Parish Outreach Partners

Mind the Gap - Africa Seeks to care for orphaned, abandoned and vulnerable children in Zimbabwe, by establishing and running small family homes, and employing local people to provide them with loving care, with particular attention to medical, nutritional, educational and developmental needs.
