Our parish Outreach initiative – established in 1974 - supports projects helping people in need, in Sheffield and around the world, through the work of our Outreach partner organisations.

Our Outreach partners are largely organisations with which members of the parish have - or have had - some connection either personally or through family or friends. Our partners help raise our awareness, pray for us and give us the opportunity to put our faith into action. Details of our current Outreach partners are in the centre pages of this leaflet.

Since the start of 2020, the parish has distributed over £35,600 - which last year included a generous legacy from a deceased parishioner - to support the work of our Outreach partners. (Not to mention gifts donated in kind in our themed collections in Lent and Advent and the once-a-month food collections for St Wilfrid's Centre and Grace Food Bank.)
