Vocations Sunday TODAY

This fourth Sunday of the Easter season is commonly known as Good Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel is always taken from Jesus' teaching in chapter 10 of John's gospel about himself as the Good Shepherd. It is also known as Vocations Sunday because on this day we pray especially that more may answer the call to serve the Church in a special way, particularly as pastors and religious.

Today we are being asked to pray in a special way for particular types of vocations which are very necessary for the life of the Church. We need pastoral shepherds for our parish communities and we do not have enough. We need the special witness that religious give through lives of celibacy, poverty and obedience.

There is a retiring collection for the Priest's Training Fund this weekend.

In a wider sense, we must also acknowledge that every one of us has a vocation. In addition to listening for the Shepherd's voice, we also need to discern just where that voice is calling us. How can we best follow where he is leading us? Where can we best serve him? Are we being asked to love God and love our neighbour in a particular way?

Each of us is called to serve. Everyone has a vocation of some kind. What is ours? The Lord our shepherd is speaking to us, directing us where we need to go. Are we listening?

Our Lady of Fátima (Feast Day this Tuesday 13 May)

This feast commemorates the visions of Our Lady seen near Fátima in Portugal in 1917 by three shepherd children, Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Jacinta and Francisco Marto. The visions occurred on the 13th day of each month from May to October, and by October huge crowds were gathering at the site of the visions and reporting visions and miraculous occurrences themselves.

Pope John Paul II was devoted to Our Lady of Fátima and attributed his survival of an assassin's bullet on 13 May 1981 to her intervention. Jacinta and Francisco Marto, who died in the great Spanish Flu pandemic of 1919-20, were beatified on 13 May 2000.

The story of the Apostle, Matthias (Feast day this Wednesday).

During the days after the Ascension, Peter stood up in the midst of about 120 of Jesus's followers and said that, to fulfil the scriptural recommendation, another person should take the place of Judas amongst the Twelve. Someone who had accompanied the apostles during the whole time that Jesus had been present with them (Acts 1:15-26) They nominated two men: Joseph Barsabbas and Matthias. They prayed and drew lots. The choice fell upon Matthias, who was added to the Eleven. Matthias is not mentioned by name anywhere else in the New Testament.
