This Sunday is World Communications Day when we are asked to reflect on the challenges and opportunities that modern means of communication offer the Church to communicate the gospel message.

The theme this year is: *Artificial Intelligence and the Wisdom of the Heart: Towards a Fully Human Communication*. In his analysis of the role of AI Pope Francis writes:

"Only by adopting a spiritual way of viewing reality, only by recovering a wisdom of the heart, can we confront and interpret the newness of our time and rediscover the path to a fully human communication... Wisdom of the heart is the virtue that enables us to integrate the whole and its parts, our decisions and their consequences, our nobility and our vulnerability, our past and our future, our individuality and our membership within a larger community.... Such wisdom cannot be sought from machines."

Our Lady of Fátima (Feast Day this Monday)

This feast commemorates the visions of Our Lady seen near Fátima in Portugal in 1917 by three shepherd children, Lúcia dos Santos and her cousins Jacinta and Francisco Marto. The visions occurred on the 13th day of each month from May to October, and by October huge crowds were gathering at the site of the visions and reporting visions and miraculous occurrences themselves.

Pope John Paul II was devoted to Our Lady of Fátima and attributed his survival of an assassin's bullet on 13 May 1981 to her intervention. Jacinta and Francisco Marto, who died in the great Spanish Flu pandemic of 1919-20, were beatified on 13 May 2000.

The story of the Apostle, Matthias

(Feast Day this Tuesday 14 May)

During the days after the Ascension, Peter stood up in the midst of about 120 of Jesus's followers and said that, to fulfil the scriptural recommendation, another person should take the place of Judas amongst the Twelve. Someone who had accompanied the apostles during the whole time that Jesus had been present with them (*Acts* 1:15-26)

They nominated two men: Matthias and Joseph Barsabbas. They prayed and drew lots. The choice fell upon Matthias, who was added to the Eleven.

Matthias is not mentioned by name anywhere else in the New Testament.
