This weekend we mark Prisoners' Sunday, the first day of the ecumenical Prisons Week, a week of prayer for, and raising awareness of issues faced by, those affected by the criminal justice system. On Prisoners' Sunday and during Prisons Week we are asked to direct our thoughts and prayers to prisoners, their families and children and to people with previous convictions. These people often find themselves on the margins of society due to the social stigma associated to imprisonment. They are often forgotten or are low on the list of causes to 'hold a hand out to'. But the gospel of Matthew 25: 36 reminds us of our duties towards them: "I was in prison, and you came to me." The Catholic Church supports the Prison Advice Trust (Pact). Cardinal Vincent Nichols is its President. Pact supports prisoners, people with convictions, and their children and families. It provides caring and life changing services at every stage of the criminal justice process: in court, in prison, on release, and in the community. Pact's vision is of a society in which justice is understood as a process of restoration and healing.

This Wednesday, is the feast day of Saint Teresa of Jesus (Teresa of Avila).

Born in 1515, she entered a Carmelite convent in 1535, but found it was poorly managed and not conducive to a life of prayer. Overcoming many obstacles, she founded a series of reformed, discalced (barefoot) Carmelite monasteries, which returned to the simplicity of the original Rule. Teresa was, a renowned mystic and a teacher of prayer. She emphasised that God leads each person by a distinct path, to which Christ shows the way. Teresa died in 1582. In 1970, the Church gave her the title Doctor of the Church.

Feast of St Ignatius of Antioch. Born in Syria in the first century AD, Ignatius converted to Christianity and eventually became bishop of Antioch. In the year 107 Emperor Trajan visited Antioch and forced the Christians there to choose between death and apostasy. Ignatius would not deny Christ and thus was condemned to face the lions in the Circus Maximus. Ignatius is well known for his seven letters, written on the journey from Antioch to his martyrdom in Rome, urging his fellow Christians to hold firm to their faith and not to be misled by heretical doctrines.
