Mass Setting - Mass of Christ the Saviour

On Friday we celebrate the **feast of St Luke**. Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and St Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

In the Acts of the Apostles we can find much background and context to the letters of St Paul. Indeed Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

This Thursday is the feast of **Saint Ignatius of Antioch**. Born in Syria in the first century AD, Ignatius converted to Christianity and eventually became bishop of Antioch. In the year 107 Emperor Trajan visited Antioch and forced the Christians there to choose between death and apostasy. Ignatius would not deny Christ and thus was condemned to face the lions in the Circus Maximus. Ignatius is well known for his seven letters, written on the journey from Antioch to his martyrdom in Rome, urging his fellow Christians to hold firm to their faith and not to be misled by heretical doctrines.
