The Bethlehem Ball 23rd November, 2024

It is 10 years since we held the first Hallam Dinner and Dance to raise funds for a hospice service in Bethlehem. After long preparation, planning and fundraising, on 1st September 2023 the

Trust opened the first licensed specialist palliative care service in Palestine. Since then its nurses have made over 1,000 home visits to care for over 90 patients. This includes 2 children. There is a waiting list of people needing care.

This year we want to celebrate the Charity's success and at the same time help these nurses to continue caring for the terminally ill and their families. Unfortunately, we had to take a long break due to Covid, so the funds to maintain this service have diminished significantly. We ask your help in making this year's event the biggest and the best to date.

Sea Sunday: Supporting the work of Stella Maris

Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all of our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Many are still being denied the right to leave their ships for even a short break away from

the relentless noise and pressure onboard. Many are reporting more stress and poorer mental health. Sea Sunday is marked on a Sunday in early-mid July - we are marking it this weekend. It is when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea. We are also encouraged to support the work of Stella Maris, formerly known as Apostleship of the Sea, the official maritime charity of the Catholic Church. The Italian Theologian and the English Rain Forecaster!

Tomorrow, Monday 15th July, we celebrate the feast of a great Franciscan, Saint Bonaventure. A friend and colleague of Saint Thomas Aquinas, this 13th century Italian theologian and doctor of the Church was revered for both his holiness and his great knowledge. Chosen as minister general of the Order in 1257, he was God's instrument in bringing it back to a deeper love of the way of its founder, Saint Francis.

Bonaventure's feast usually takes precedence liturgically over an English saint whose feast day is also on 15th July and whose name is much more familiar, Saint Swithun.

As with many Anglo-Saxon saints, Swithun's story combines a handful of hard facts with many legends. An adviser to kings of Wessex in the first half of the 9th century, Swithun was Bishop of Winchester for the last 10 years of his life. One legend claims that Swithun built the first stone bridge over the River Itchen that runs through the city. His most famous miracle tells of an act of kindness to a poor woman. When crossing the bridge, she was jostled and dropped her basket of eggs. The saint made her broken eggs whole again. Many miracles were recorded at his shrine in Winchester Cathedral during the middle ages - before it was destroyed during the Reformation.

One source claims that when Swithun died, he asked to be buried out of doors where the feet of ordinary men could pass over him.' This, and a possible mistranslation of a medieval text, may have given rise to the story that when the saint's bones were moved inside the Old Minster on his feast day in 971, a terrible storm broke out, lasting for 40 days and nights. Hence the popular saying that if it rains on 15th July, it will rain for the next 40 days. Meteorologists insist that their rainfall statistics do not support this legend. But, with the holiday season approaching, a quick prayer for the intercession of St Swithun mightn't do any harm!
