


Penitential Service - There will be a penitential Service at OLST on Wednesday, at 7.30pm. Please come along. Confessions will be available afterwards.

Christmas Day Evening Mass at St Marie's Cathedral: There will be a 6.30pm evening Mass on Christmas Day (Wednesday 25 December) at St Marie's Cathedral.

Opening of the Jubilee Year 2025 - Saturday 28th December, 12.30pm

The rite of the Opening of the Jubilee Year will take place on Saturday 28th December, at which Bishop Ralph will preside. The celebration will start at the Sheffield Anglican Cathedral at 12.30pm, from which there will be a procession to St Marie's Cathedral for the opening Mass. All from across the Diocese are encouraged to come and celebrate the beginning of this special year, in which all are invited "to an intense experience of the love of God" and "a lively experience of grace and hope" (Francis, Spes non confundit, 6)!

The Eucharistic celebration will take the form of a stational Mass. A stational Mass of the Diocesan Bishop, also known as a Pontifical Mass, where all the Priests concelebrate with the Bishop; with the Deacons and the other Ministers carrying out their proper service.

Pilgrim Passports with all details of all celebrations throughout the year will be available shortly.

THANKYOU FROM THE PARISH OUTREACH GROUP: Christmas is the time for gifts, but our parishioners seem willing to give to Outreach all year round! Thanks to your generosity we have raised a magnificent total of £56,110 since 2017. This has come from the monthly "Give to Live" cash collection, the 100 Club, events such as the parish raffle and Coffee, Cakes and Crafts and individual donations and bequests.

Your donations have meant that we have been able to provide financial support on your behalf to our local and overseas partners. Examples of this include Mind the Gap (Zimbabwe) - £9950 since 2017, Reaching the Unreached (Southern India) - £4050, ASSIST (support for asylum seekers) - £5250, Ben's Centre for Vulnerable Adults – £4200, Sheffield Samaritans - £4250 and SVP Furniture Store - £3800. Partners such as the Kwakakulu Community Project (Kenya) have now become self-supporting thanks to our help.

OUTREACH - These disbursements have just been made following the autumn fundaraising! £750 to Reaching the Unreached, £700 each to Ascend and SVP Furniture Store, and £350 to Caritas Hallam.

A happy Christmas and many thanks from the Outreach group for your generosity. Please continue to support us in 2025.

Retiring Collection - Caritas Hallam. Caritas provides a loving service to those within our communities, for instance 10,000 hours of counselling was delivered last year which included supporting children and their families in 24 of our schools, 100 referrals for domestic abuse, 15 wellbeing courses, relationship counselling and family therapy across the whole of the Diocese.

Gaudete Sunday

Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, takes its name from the Latin word gaudete, which means rejoice. The priest may wear rose-coloured vestments instead of the purple/violet which is prescribed for all other non-Saints days in Advent. The readings for Gaudete Sunday focus on rejoicing in the Lord as well as the mission of St. John the Baptist.

Theologian Henri Nouwen expressed the difference between joy and happiness in these terms. "While happiness is dependent on external conditions, joy is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing - sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death - can take that love away." Thus joy can be present even in the midst of sadness. In his 2014 Gaudete Sunday homily, Pope Francis said that Gaudete Sunday is known as the "Sunday of joy," and that instead of fretting about all they still haven't done to prepare for Christmas, people should "think of all the good things life has given you."
