

### Passiontide

Formerly known as Passion Sunday, this, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, begins the two weeks of Passiontide, when we reflect on the passion of Our Lord, following him in his suffering and watching as his death unfolds.

All the crosses are veiled in purple. So too are the statues and pictures, so as not to distract us from the passion of Jesus. Votive candles are not available during this time. If we are trying to concentrate on the sufferings of Our Lord, it would be a contradiction to light candles to Our Lady and the Saints.

## The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph, We celebrate his feast day this Tuesday, 19 March.

We don't know much about Joseph except what is mentioned in the Gospels. He was the husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. Holy Scripture proclaims him as a "just man", and the Church has turned to Joseph for his patronage and protection.

In 1870 Pope Pius IX declared him Patron of the Universal Church. He is also the patron of the dying because Jesus and Mary were at his death-bed. He is also the patron of fathers, of carpenters, and of social justice. Many religious orders and communities are placed under his patronage.

## A Family Prayer to St Joseph

Great St Joseph, you were chosen by God to be the Head of the Holy Family. Kindly look down upon us and bestow thy fatherly protection upon our home.

Model of the most lively faith, obtain for all the members of our family the grace to believe firmly what God has revealed and to bear witness to our faith in all we do.

May we ever remain bound together by the ties of true Christian love in the unity of the Holy Catholic Church, and taste the peace that Jesus has promised his true disciples.

Grant that we may all love one another as children of God and work together for the salvation of souls, in order to fulfil our role in the great family of the Church and be reunited after this life in the happiness of heaven. **Amen.**
