World Day of the Poor - THIS SUNDAY

Pope Francis has declared Sunday 17 November 2024 to be the eighth World Day of the Poor, with the theme of "The prayer of the poor rises up to God."

The expression that gives the 2024 World Day of the Poor its theme is taken from the Book of Sirach (21:5), which Pope Francis says is not sufficiently known and deserves to be discovered for the richness of its themes. In his message for this World Day of the Poor, the Holy Father reiterates that; "the poor hold a privileged place in God's heart" and invites everyone to learn to pray for the poor and to pray together with the poor, with humility and trust.

In his message Pope Francis criticises policies that promote wars. He writes: "The violence caused by wars clearly shows the arrogance of those who consider themselves to be powerful before men and women, but they are poor in the eyes of God. How many more people are impoverished by misguided policies involving weapons! How many innocent victims! Yet we cannot turn our backs to this reality."

The Holy Father highlighted the example of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, who spent her life working for the poor and who described herself as "only a poor sister who prays."

We are called in every circumstance to be friends of the poor, "following in the footsteps of Jesus who always began by showing solidarity when dealing with the least among us," the pope said.

Pope Francis's Prayer Intention for November
For those who have lost a child.

"What can we say to parents who have lost a child? How can we console them? There are no words," the Holy Father said in a video released 31 October 2024. He pointed out that "when one spouse loses the other, they are a widower or a widow. A child who loses a parent is an orphan. There's a word for that. But when a parent loses a child, there's no word. The pain is so great that there's no word.

And it's not natural to outlive your child. The pain caused by this loss is especially intense," he said. "Words of encouragement are at times banal or sentimental, they're not helpful. Spoken with the best intention, of course, they can end up aggravating the wound." The pope explained that in order to comfort parents who have lost a child, "we need to listen to them, to be close to them with love, to care responsibly for the pain they feel, imitating how Jesus Christ consoled those who were afflicted." He concluded with a prayer: "Let us pray that all parents

Who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community and may receive peace of heart from the Spirit of Consolation."

Prayer for the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lord our God, give us grace to serve you always with joy, because our full and lasting happiness is to make of our lives a constant service to the Author of all that is good. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

This Friday, 22 November, is the Feast of St Cecelia. Like many early martyrs, little is known about Cecilia. No-one knows why she should have become widely popular in the middle of the sixth century, some 200 years after her death. Her association with music is also a mystery. Devotion to St Cecilia has spread far and wide because of *"The Passion of Saint Cecilia",* which holds her up as a perfect example of a Christian woman, who embraced virginity and suffered martyrdom for the love of Christ.

This Thursday, 21 November, is the feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (not to be confused with the major feast of the Presentation of the Lord – Candlemas – on 2 February). First celebrated in the sixth century in Jerusalem, it became a feast of the universal Church in the 1500's. As with Mary's birth, we read of Mary's presentation in the temple only in apocryphal literature, in the Protoevangelium of James. Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasises that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued

through her early childhood and beyond.
