**This Sunday is World Communications Day**. The event was established in 1967 to encourage us to reflect on the opportunities and challenges that the modern means of social communication afford the Church to communicate the gospel message.

The theme for this year's World Day of Social Communications, chosen by the late Pope Francis, is 'Share with gentleness the hope that is in your hearts'. Read the late Pope's pre-prepared message at https://www.cbcew.org.uk/wcd25-papal-message/

**Developing similar themes, four days into his election to the papacy, Pope Leo** held an audience with the men and women who were in Rome to report on the death of Pope Francis, the conclave, and the first days of his own ministry. The newly-elected Pope began his remarks with a call for communication to foster peace by caring for how people and events are presented.

He invited media professionals to promote a different kind of communication, one that "does not seek consensus at all costs, does not use aggressive words, does not follow the culture of competition, and never separates the search for truth from the love with which we must humbly seek it. The way we communicate is of fundamental importance. We must say 'no' to the war of words and images; we must reject the paradigm of war."

"Let us disarm communication of all prejudice and resentment, fanaticism and even hatred," he said. "Let us disarm words, and we will help disarm the world."

On Friday 6 June we celebrate the **Feast of St Norbert**. Born of a noble family in the Rhineland in 1180, he lived a worldly life until a narrow escape from death at the age of 35 led him to become a priest full of reforming zeal. He was commissioned as a travelling preacher in France and Germany. Others joined him, and a community was started in the valley of Prémontré near Laon, which developed into the Premonstratensian Order.

As Archbishop of Magdeburg he reformed what had been a corrupt diocese, which prompted several failed attempts to murder him. He also preached the gospel to the pagans of the district. He died (of natural causes) in 1134.

# **Prayer for World Communications Day**

O God, whose word is truth and in whose light we see light, guide those who tell the story of our times through word and image. Make them seekers after truth and advocates of human dignity.

Grant discernment to all who rely on their labours, and, as we confront the pain and promise of this world, awaken in us a sense of wonder at your presence and of longing for your peace.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen

This Tuesday we celebrate the feast of the Ugandan martyrs, **St Charles Lwanga and his companions**.

Between 1885 and 1887, many Christians, Catholic and Protestant, were killed by the Ugandan king Mwanga. Some of them were servants in the king's palace or even his personal attendants.

Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one companions (the youngest, Kizito, was only 13) were executed for being Christians, for rebuking the king for his debauchery and his murder of an Anglican missionary, for "praying from a book," and for refusing to submit to immoral acts. Most of them were burned alive in a group after being tortured.

Pope Paul VI canonised these 22 martyrs on October 18, 1964. St. Charles Lwanga is the patron saint of African Catholic Youth Action.

Thursday 5 June is **the feast day of St Boniface**. Born in Devon around the year 675, he joined the Benedictine abbey at Nursling, near Southampton. Wishing to preach the gospel in a foreign land, in 718 he was commissioned by Pope Gregory II, to evangelise the heathen tribes of Germany. Boniface had great success in his mission. In later years he helped to reform the Frankish church, and then, over seventy years old, set out to evangelise Friesland (part of modern Holland) where he was set upon and murdered, on 5 June 754. He is honoured as the apostle of Germany.
