**This Thursday, 25 January,** we celebrate the Feast of the *Conversion of the St Paul*. Described in Acts of the Apostles (9:1-22 and 22:3-16), the tentmaker from Tarsus's encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus changed Saul, the zealous persecutor of Christians, into St Paul, the great founding Christian missionary theologian.


One sentence determined Paul's theology: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5b). Jesus was identified with the group of people whom he, as the zealot Saul, had been running down like criminals. Jesus, he now saw, was the mysterious fulfilment of all he had been blindly pursuing. Paul's life became a tireless proclaiming and living out of the message of the cross: Christians die baptismally to sin and are buried with Christ. They are made into a new creation, already sharing Christ's victory and someday to rise from the dead like him. Through this risen Christ, the Father pours out the Spirit on them, making them completely new. Two of St Paul's early converts were Timothy and Titus, whose feast is the following day, Friday 26 January. They became Paul's companions and helpers. Paul entrusted Timothy with the care of Christian in Ephesus and sent Titus to Crete to look after the Christians there. Timothy and Titus were the recipients of Paul's so-called "pastoral epistles", giving advice for pastors and laypeople alike.

#### A scriptural reflection for Sunday of the Word of God

Today, as the Roman Catholic Church celebrates this 'Sunday of the Word of God', Pope Francis reminds us: *Christ Jesus is knocking at our door in the words of sacred scripture. If we hear his voice and open the doors of our mind and hearts, then he will enter our lives and remain ever with us.* In the First Reading, Jonah takes the word of God to the people in Nineveh. They hear it, are inspired to change their evil ways, and God shows them his mercy.

God's love and forgiveness are at the heart of the Psalm, as we pray for better understanding of the ways in which the Lord invites us to live our lives. St Paul issues a challenge to the Christian community in Corinth in this week's Second Reading. At the centre of this, though, is an encouragement to us to free our minds and hearts from reliance on the things of this world, and to place our hope in the reign of God.

The Gospel speaks of the opening of the hearts and minds of the first apostles as they leave behind everything they know in order to follow Jesus. This week, perhaps I can give myself the gift of a little extra time with scripture. I pray that the Lord will open my mind and heart, so I can see more clearly where my path with him lies.

# Pope Francis' prayer intention for the month of January is for the Gift of Diversity in the Church.

"There is no need to fear the diversity of charisms in the Church. Rather, living this diversity should make us rejoice. To move forward on the journey of faith, we also need ecumenical dialogue with our brothers and sisters of other confessions and Christian communities. This is not something confusing or disturbing but is a gift God gives to the Christian community so it might grow as one body, the body of Christ. If we are guided by the Holy Spirit, abundance, variety, diversity, never cause conflict. The Holy Spirit reminds us first and foremost that we are children loved by God - everyone equal in God's love, and everyone different." Pope Francis concludes with a prayer: "Let us pray that the Spirit helps us recognise the gift of different charisms within the Christian communities and to discover the richness of different ritual traditions within the Catholic Church."

#### **Prayer for Christian Unity**

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of the Holy Spirit, the giver of life, who makes us more open to each other, resolves conflict, and strengthens our bonds of communion. May we grow in mutual affection and in the desire to announce the Gospel message more faithfully, that the world may come together in unity and welcome the Prince of Peace. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
