The Bethlehem Ball 23rd November, 2024

It is 10 years since we held the first Hallam Dinner and Dance to raise funds for a hospice service in Bethlehem. After long preparation, planning and fundraising, on 1st September 2023 the Trust opened the first licensed specialist palliative care service in Palestine. Since then its nurses have made over 1,000 home visits to care for over 90 patients. This includes 2 children. There is a waiting list of people needing care.



This year we want to celebrate the Charity's success and at the same time help these nurses to continue caring for the terminally ill and their families. Unfortunately, we had to take a long break due to Covid, so the funds to maintain this service have diminished significantly. We ask your help in making this year's event the biggest and the best to date.

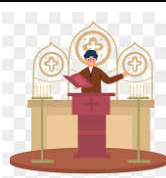

Our Local Derbyshire Martyrs

This coming Wednesday, 24 July, is the feast day of two of the martyrs of the Catholic mission to Elizabethan England, **Blessed Nicholas Garlick** and **Blessed Robert Ludlam**. Born respectively in Dinting (near Glossop) and Radborne (near Derby), they were ordained to the priesthood at the English College in Rheims. They returned to England in 1582/83, travelling around the country and ministering to the faithful before their arrest in 1588 at the Padley home of the Catholic Fitzherbert family. Convicted of treason, they were hung, drawn and quartered on 24th July at St. Mary’s Bridge, Derby. They were amongst 85 martyrs of England and Wales beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1987.

The grounds of the ruined Padley Hall – though not the chapel – are open all year round, so you might like to make your own pilgrimage there and say some prayers in the open air where the Padley Pilgrimage Masses take place. The chapel itself is open on Sunday afternoons, 2-4 pm until the end of September.

Saint Mary Magdalene

This Monday, 22 July, is the feast day of Saint Mary Magdalene Except for the mother of Jesus, few women are more honoured in the Bible. Mary Magdalene was one of the many “who were assisting Jesus and the Twelve out of their means.” She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the “official” witnesses who might have been chosen for the first awareness of the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

Mary Magdalene has been a victim of mistaken identity for almost 20 centuries. Which - if any - of the “sinful” or “possessed” women referred to in various passages in the Gospels was she? She might perhaps suggest that it makes no difference. We are all sinners in need of the saving power of God, whether our sins have been lurid or not. More importantly, we are all, with her, “unofficial” witnesses of the Resurrection.
