Our Lady of Walsingham (*Feast day on Tuesday*) The lady of the manor of Walsingham, Richeldis de Faverches, was instructed by a vision of the Virgin Mary to build in her village an exact replica of the house in Nazareth in which the Annunciation had taken place,

The vision occurred, according to tradition, in 1061. The original shrine was destroyed in the Reformation, but during the 19th and early 20th centuries pilgrimage to Walsingham was revived.

O Mary, recall the solemn moment when Jesus,

your Divine son, dying on the cross, confided us to your maternal care.

Pray, O holy Mother of God

for the conversion of England, restoration of the sick, consolation for the afflicted, repentance of sinners, peace to the departed.

O Blessed Mary, Mother of God, Our Lady of Walsingham, intercede for us. Amen.

St Pius of Pietrelcina, (also known as Padre Pio), whose fear day is on Monday, was born in 1887 in southern Italy, and joined the Capuchin friars at the age of 16. He became a priest seven years later, and spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor, and intercessor. Many miracles were ascribed to him during his lifetime. He died a few days after the fiftieth anniversary of his receiving the stigmata, and over 100,000 people attended his funeral.

On Friday we celebrate the feast of

St Vincent de Paul. Tradition says that Vincent became a priest with little more ambition than to have a comfortable life. But the deathbed confession of a dying servant opened his eyes to the spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. After working in Paris among galley-slaves, he became leader of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission (the Vincentians). These priests devoted themselves to the people in smaller towns and villages. Later he established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of eachparish. With St Louise de Marillac he also founded the Sisters of Charity.
