This coming Saturday, 1st March, is the Feast Day of Saint David, the patron saint of Wales. We have very little reliable information about him. He was a priest, and later bishop, engaged in missionary work in the mid 500's, and founded many monasteries practising austere lifestyles, including one at Mynyw, now called St. David's. As he lay dying in old age in the year 589, his last words to his monks and subjects were: "Be joyful, brothers and sisters. Keep your faith, and do the little things that you have seen and heard with me."

This Tuesday is the feast day of St Ethelbert, the King of Kent, who was converted to Christianity by the future St. Augustine of Canterbury on his mission to England from Rome in the closing years of the sixth century. Ethelbert, who was married to Bertha, a Christian daughter of King Charibert of Paris, was baptised in 597, bringing a large part of his population into the faith. He did not enforce conversions, but he brought the king of the East Saxons and the king of the East Angles into the Church. Ethelbert ruled for fifty-six years, founding the abbeys of Christ Church, Ss. Peter and Paul in Canterbury, and St. Andrew's in Rochester.
