This Saturday, 30 November, is the **feast of St Andrew the Apostle**. Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras {in Western Greece), where his remains were preserved. Many of his relics were not long afterwards transferred to Constantinople, from where, it is commonly believed, some of them were brought to Scotland.

This Monday we celebrate the **Feast of St Catherine of Alexandria,** a martyr of the pre-Christian Roman empire. According to the *Legend of St. Catherine*, she converted to Christianity following a vision. At 18 she debated 50 pagan philosophers, and they became Christians - as did 200 soldiers and members of the emperor's family. All were martyred. Sentenced to be executed on a spiked wheel, Catherine is said to have touched the wheel and it shattered. She was then beheaded.
