#### 2. Small-scale farmers have little choice over what they grow

*Five of every six farms in the world consist of less than two hectares, operate only around 12 percent of all agricultural land, and produce roughly 35 per cent of the world's food. So small-scale farmers are efficient at producing food. But the domination of huge companies known as agribusiness means that they often face little choice about what they grow or how they grow it.*

## Our Lady of Perpetual Succour

Tomorrow, Monday 27 June, is the **Feast** of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour (also known as Our Lady of Unfailing – or Perpetual - Help). For our Diocese of Hallam the feast ranks as a Solemnity, as when the diocese was formed in 1980, she was named as its patroness.

Our Lady of Perpetual Succour is one of the most popular representations of Our Lady. The icon shows the Blessed Virgin Mary wearing a dress of dark red, representing the Passion of Jesus; with a blue mantle representing her perpetual virginity; and with a cloaked veil representing her modesty. On the left side is the Archangel Michael; on the right side is the Archangel Gabriel. The star on Mary's forehead signifies her title as Star of the Sea. As well as Hallam, Our Lady of Perpetual Succour is patroness of many other dioceses around the world. Mother of Perpetual Help, you have been blessed and favoured by God.

You became not only the Mother of the Redeemer, but Mother of the redeemed as well.

We come to you today as your loving children.

Watch over us and take care of us.

As you held the child Jesus in your loving arms, so take us in your arms.

Be a mother ready at every moment to help us.

For God who is mighty has done great things for you, and God's mercy is from age to age on those who love God.

Intercede for us, dear Mother,

in obtaining pardon for our sins, love for Jesus, final perseverance, and the grace always to call upon you, Mother of Perpetual Help.

## Thought for the week

Today's Mass readings remind us of the costs of discipleship. As Jesus makes his way to Jerusalem (and all that that will mean for him), a number of people express a desire to join him. Obviously – like many of us – they do not fully understand just precisely what “going to Jerusalem” really means for Jesus and those who go with him. Jesus's response, echoing that of Elijah in the first reading, is uncompromising – immediate, wholehearted and unconditional obedience to God's will. Yet Paul teaches that it's this obedience that gives true freedom. To be fully free means trusting in God's will and not clinging to external securities like money, property, status, success, achievements and the like.

We see this also as we celebrate the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul** this Wednesday, 29 June.

Paul's experience of the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus was the driving force that made him one of the most zealous, dynamic, and courageous ambassadors of Christ that the Church has ever had.

But persecution, humiliation, and weakness became his day-by-day carrying of the cross

“Think of God's mercy, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings, by offering your living bodies as a holy sacrifice, truly pleasing to God. Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. This is the only way to discover the will of God and know what is good, what it is that God wants, what is the perfect thing to do.”
