**Next Saturday is** the first Saturday of the month therefore Mass will be at 10am. Followed by Exposition, Benediction and Confessions.



# Saint Augustine of Canterbury

In the last decade of the 6<sup>th</sup> Century Pope Gregory the Great sent a mission to evangelise the Anglo-Saxons in England. Augustine was appointed to lead the mission. On landing in Kent in 597, he received a friendly welcome from the pagan King Ethelbert, who provided a residence for the mission at Canterbury and on Pentecost Sunday was himself baptised. Augustine constructed a church and monastery near where the present cathedral now stands. The faith spread, but the work was slow. Augustine sometimes made mistakes, particularly in failing to reconcile the long established British Christian communities in western England. The eventual success of his mission, and his perseverance amidst obstacles, fears and doubts, teaches today's evangelisers and campaigners to keep striving in the face of the inevitable setbacks and frustrations.

# Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary The celebration of this feast goes back – perhaps surprisingly - only to the 13th or 14th century. It was established widely throughout the Church as a focus of prayer for unity. The present date for its celebration was set in 1969, in order to follow the Annunciation of the Lord and precede the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. Like most feasts of Mary, it is closely connected with Jesus and his saving work. The more visible actors in the visitation drama (Luke 1:39-45) are Mary and Elizabeth. However, Jesus and John the Baptist steal the scene in a hidden way. Jesus makes John leap with joy - the joy of messianic salvation. Elizabeth, in turn, is filled with the Holy Spirit and addresses words of praise to Mary - words that echo down through the ages. Elizabeth's praise of Mary as "the mother of my Lord" can be viewed as the earliest Church's devotion to Mary. As with all authentic devotion to Mary, Elizabeth's words first praise God for what God has done to Mary. Only secondly does she praise Mary for trusting God's word. Then comes the Magnificat (Luke 1:46-55). Here, Mary herself – like the Church – traces all her greatness to God. **Reflection on the Holy Trinity** We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. It is a wholly creative and energising reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the Holy Trinity is preserved. Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is above all things and through all things and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit. St Athanasius (4th Century)
