#### **Saint Andrew**

This Thursday, 30 November, is the feast of St Andrew the Apostle. Matthew's Gospel refers to Andrew being called - together with his brother Simon Peter - directly by Jesus as they were fishing on the Sea of Galilee, John presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras {in Western Greece), where his remains were preserved. Many of his relics were not long afterwards transferred to Constantinople, from where, it is commonly believed, some of them were brought to Scotland.

#### **Thought for the Week: Christ the King**

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, on the sixteenth centenary of the Council of Nicaea (AD 325) at which the doctrine of the consubstantiality of Christ with the Father was defined. The Pope asserted that the most effective defence against the destructive forces of the age is the recognition of the kingship of Christ; and, furthermore, a feast which is celebrated every year by everyone is a far better way of deploying that defence than any number of books written by learned people.

Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, to you we turn in humble prayer.  
Look with favour on all young people, bearers of hope for the Church and the world.
