### This weekend the Church marks its fourth World Day for Grandparents and

the Elderly. Pope Francis instituted this Day in 2021 since, he believes, grandparents are often forgotten, yet they are the link between generations, passing on the experience of life and faith to the young.

Pope Francis reminds us that God never abandons his children. He chose the theme: "Do not cast me off in my old age" (*Ps* 71:9). He writes: "God never abandons his children.. Even when our age advances and our powers decline, when our hair grows

white and our role in society lessens, when our lives become less productive and can risk appearing useless. All too often, loneliness is the bleak companion of our lives as elderly persons and grandparents. Often, when I was Bishop of Buenos Aires, I would visit rest homes and realise how rarely those people received visits. Some had not seen their family members for many months.

. . . Once we lose sight of the value of each individual, people are then judged in terms of their cost, which is in some cases considered too high to pay. Even worse, sometimes the elderly themselves fall victim to this mindset; they are made to consider themselves a burden."

As an example for us to follow, Pope Francis cite the biblical figure of Ruth (Ruth 1: 1-24). She refused to abandon her mother-in-law, the elderly widow Naomi, after her (Ruth's) husband and his brother - Naomi's two sons - had died. Ruth chose to remain close to Naomi rather than returning to her own kindred, and was then blessed with a happy marriage, a family, a new home. "This is always the case: by remaining close to the elderly and acknowledging their unique role in the family, in society and in the Church, we will ourselves receive gifts, graces, many blessings!

Let us show our tender love for the grandparents and elderly members of our families and spend time with them. In place of the self-centred attitude that leads to loneliness and abandonment, let us instead show the open heart and the joyful face of men and women who have the courage to say "I will not abandon you."

### The Bethlehem Ball 23rd November, 2024

It is 10 years since we held the first Hallam Dinner and Dance to raise funds for a hospice service in Bethlehem. After long preparation, planning and fundraising, on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 the Trust opened the

first licensed specialist palliative care service in Palestine. Since then its nurses have made over 1,000 home visits to care for over 90 patients. This includes 2 children. There is a waiting list of people needing care. This year we want to celebrate the Charity's success and at the same time help these nurses to continue caring for the terminally ill and their families. Unfortunately, we had to take a long break due to Covid, so the funds to maintain this service have diminished significantly. We ask your help in making this year's event the biggest and the best to date.

The Bethlehem Ball will be held at the Niagara Conference Centre in Sheffield, on Saturday, 23rd November. It is a Dinner and Dance in a lovely venue and the tickets at £35 each are modestly priced for such an event. Dancing to the Grand Plan.

St Alphosus De Liguori, whose feast day is on Thursday, founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists), an association of priests and brothers living a common life, dedicated to the imitation of Christ, and working mainly in popular missions for peasants in rural areas. Alphonsus's great pastoral reforms were in the pulpit and confessional. He is best known for his moral theology, but his Glories of Mary is one of the great works on that subject, and his book Visits to the Blessed Sacrament went through 40 editions in his lifetime, greatly influencing the practice of this devotion in the Church.

#### Mass Setting - Mass of Christ the Saviour

#### Gloria 1013; Holy, Holy 1014; Memorial Acclamation 1016-1017; Lamb of God 1019

This Wednesday we celebrate the feast of Saint Ignatius of Loyola. Born in 1491 in the Basque region, this wounded soldier of fortune became a warrior of God after a long and difficult spiritual journey, during which Ignatius began to write down material that later became his greatest work, the *Spiritual Exercises*. At the age of 43, he and six others - one of whom was Saint Francis Xavier vowed to live in poverty and chastity and offered themselves to the apostolic service of the pope. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III in 1538, and Ignatius elected as the first general. Ignatius's spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, *Ad majorem Dei gloriam* - "for the greater glory of God." Ignatius died on 31 July 1556.

#### **Pope Francis' Prayer Intention**

For the pastoral care of the sick

"The priest and those who are present during the Anointing of the Sick represent the entire Christian community that, as one body, embraces the one who suffers and their family, nurturing their faith and hope, and supporting them through their prayers and compassion." *Pope Francis* 

We pray that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may grant the Lord's strength to those who receive it and to their loved ones, and that it may become for everyone an ever more visible sign of compassion and hope.

**St Peter Chrysologus**, whose feast day is on Tuesday, lived from around 380 to 450. He had a thirst for learning – which he looked upon not as a mere opportunity but as an obligation for all, as a solid support for the worship of God. Many of his short sermons have come down to us. They are full of moral applications. So authentic were the contents of his sermons that some 13 centuries later, he was declared a doctor of the Church by Pope Benedict XIII.
