On Monday we celebrate the feast of the **Ugandan martyrs**, St Charles Lwanga and his companions. Between 1885 and 1887, many Christians, Catholic and Protestant, were killed by the Ugandan king Mwanga. Some of them were servants in the king's palace or even his personal attendants. Charles Lwanga and his twenty-one companions (the youngest, Kizito, was only 13) were executed for being Christians, for rebuking the king for his debauchery and his murder of an Anglican missionary, for "praying from a book," and for refusing to submit to immoral acts. Most of them were burned alive in a group after being tortured. Pope Paul VI canonised these 22 martyrs on October 18, 1964. St. Charles Lwanga is the patron saint of African Catholic Youth Action.

## Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

Although formalised as recently as 1944, the celebration of the Immaculate Heart of Mary dates back to at least the seventeenth century, In the nineteenth century, Popes Pius VII and Pius IX allowed several churches to celebrate a feast of the Pure Heart of Mary. Pius XII instituted our current feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary for the whole Church, during the midst of World War 2, so as to obtain by her intercession "peace among nations, freedom for the Church, the conversion of sinners, the love of purity and the practice of virtue". Initially celebrated on 22 August, coinciding with the traditional octave day of the Assumption, the feast was moved in 1969 by Pope Paul VI to the Saturday immediately after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

## **Corpus Christi**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of

**Christ**, also known as Corpus Christi, originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. It is celebrated either on the Thursday following the Trinity Sunday or, as in this country, on the Sunday following that feast.

This feast calls us to focus on two manifestations of the Body of Christ, the Holy Eucharist and the Church. The primary purpose is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The opening prayer at Mass calls our attention to Jesus' suffering and death and our worship of Him, especially in the Eucharist. At every Mass our attention is called to the Eucharist and the Real Presence of Christ in it. The secondary focus is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church. The Church is called the Body of Christ because of the intimate communion which Jesus shares with his disciples. He expresses this in the gospels by using the metaphor of a body in which He is the head.

The Feast of Corpus Christi is commonly used as an opportunity for public Eucharistic processions, which serves as a sign of common faith and adoration. Our worship of Jesus in His Body and Blood calls us to offer to God our Father a pledge of undivided love and an offering of ourselves to the service of others.

#### The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

The moveable feast (Solemnity) of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus falls on the Friday that is 19 days after Pentecost Sunday, so this year it will be this Friday 7 June. The feast day of the Sacred Heart was approved for specified dioceses by Pope Clement XIII in 1765, and extended to the whole Church by Pius XI in 1856. In 1899, Pope Leo XIII dedicated the whole Catholic world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The month of June is dedicated to The Sacred Heart of Jesus. Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a very old practice originally arising out of devotion to the Sacred Wounds of Christ and all that His sacrifice for us embodied. It is a beautiful practice with which you can get closer to Jesus in contemplation of the Passion and His most perfect sacrifice.
