Ash Wednesday and Lent 2025

We begin our 2025 Lenten journey this Wednesday, 5 March. Ash Wednesday is a **day of fasting and abstinence**. Masses (both at Meadowhead) are at 10.00am and 7.30pm.

On Ash Wednesday, we are reminded that we are called to turn away from sin, to repent and to believe the Good News of our salvation through Jesus Christ.

Ash Wednesday is the doorway into our Lenten season of renewal – a day rich in associations and symbolism. It marks the beginning of Lent – a time for turning again to the practice of our faith, in prayer, self-denial (fasting) and practical generosity (almsgiving). This period also represents the 40 days that Jesus spent in the desert as well as the 40 years that the Israelites spent in exile.

The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday come from the burned palms from last year's Palm Sunday celebration,
