All Saints' and All Souls' Days; This year in England and Wales, All Saints' Day is transferred form the 1st to 2nd November. All Souls' Day is transferred to Monday 3rd November.

Remembrance Mass on 3rd November: On All Souls Day there will be a Mass, with school in the morning and an evening Mass at 7.00pm. The evening Mass will be a Family Memorial Mass when we remember, give thanks, and pray for family and friends who have died (not just the dead from our own parish). Please come along. This service is for everyone - and please invite people you know as well, especially those bereaved in the past two years. The SVP will be providing tea and coffee in the parish rooms afterwards.

About All Souls Day - The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on November 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church. (This year, with All Saints Day, transferred from Saturday to Sunday, we commemorate All Souls Day on 3 November) The feast acknowledges human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. What this process of purification is like, it is perhaps not helpful for us to speculate. Prayer for a loved one is, for the believer, a way of erasing any distance, even death. In prayer we stand in God's presence in the company of someone we love, even if that person has gone before us into death. Naturally, we will remember especially family members and good friends, but we should also think of those who may not have anyone to remember them.

About All Saints Day

The earliest certain observance of a feast in honour of all the saints is an early fourth-century commemoration of "all the martyrs." Later, when Christians were free to worship according to their consciences, the Church acknowledged other paths to sanctity.

In the early centuries the only criterion was popular acclaim, even when the bishop's approval became the final step in placing a commemoration on the calendar. The first papal canonisation occurred in 993.

The lengthy process now required to prove extraordinary sanctity has developed over the last 500 years. Today's feast honours the obscure as well as the famous - the saints each of us have known.

This Tuesday, 4 November, is the feast day of St Charles Borromeo. A saint of the Catholic Counter-Reformation in the second half of the 16th century. Born in 1538, after obtaining a doctorate in civil and canon law, he was appointed a cardinal and bishop of Milan where the religious and moral life was in urgent needed of renewal. If the people were to be converted to a better life, Borromeo had to be the first to give a good example. He sacrificed wealth, high honours, esteem, and influence to become poor. During the plague and famine of 1576, Borromeo tried to feed 60,000 to 70,000 people daily. To do this he borrowed large sums of money that required years to repay. Whilst the civil authorities fled at the height of the plague, he stayed in the city, where he ministered to the sick and the dying, helping those in want. Work and the heavy burdens of his office affected his health, leading to his death at the age of 46.
