The Advent Wreath

This weekend Fr Clement will bless our Advent Wreaths and the first candle will be lit. The wreath - containing four candles, one more of which is lit each Sunday in Advent — is created out of evergreen foliage, symbolising everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. Some wreaths have a fifth candle which is placed in the middle of the wreath and is lighted on Christmas Day.

The *first* purple candle symbolises hope, and is called the "**Prophets' Candle**". The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.

The *second* candle represents faith – some traditions say it also represents love - and is called the "**Bethlehem Candle**". Micah had foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, also the birthplace of King David.

The *third* candle symbolises joy and is called the "Shepherds' Candle". To the shepherds' great joy, the angels announced that Christ came for humble, unimportant people like them, too. In the liturgy, the colour rose signifies joy, and this candle is that colour to represent rejoicing.

The *fourth* candle represents peace and is called the "Angels' Candle". The angels announced that the Messiah came to bring peace. He came to bring people close to God and to each other again.

The optional *fifth* candle represents light and purity and is called "Christ's Candle". It is placed in the middle and is lighted on Christmas Day. This candle is white to represent pure light and victory.

The Season of Advent and the Gospel of Matthew

This weekend we begin the first part of Advent, which continues until 16th December. The focus is on the "Parousia", the end times, the final coming of Christ.

The second part, from 17th to the 24th, focuses on the first coming of Christ on Bethlehem.

(On their Living Space / Sacred Space website, https://livingspace.sacredspace.ie/aa011/ the Irish Jesuits suggest that there is a third kind of coming we need to be aware of, namely, when God enters our lives every day. Every single experience can be an opportunity to make contact with God.)

The season of Advent marks the start of a new liturgical year for the Church. The readings for Sunday Mass are arranged on a three-year cycle. Each year features a different Gospel - Matthew, Mark, or Luke. Readings from the Gospel of John are interspersed throughout all three years. Today we begin Cycle A of the Lectionary, and the Gospel of Matthew.

Matthew's Gospel was written for the early Judaeo-Christian community. Only Mark's Gospel is considered to be more ancient. It contains some of the most important passages for Christianity including the Sermon on the Mount, the Lord's Prayer and the great commission to go out and evangelise all nations.

This Wednesday, 3 December, is the feast of **St Francis Xavier**. Born in Spain in 1506 he became a teacher of philosophy in Paris. Under the influence of his friend and mentor Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus, he studied for the priesthood, being ordained in 1537. In 1541 he went to the East where for ten years he preached the Gospel in India and Japan. From Japan he had dreams of going to China, but before reaching the mainland, he died on the island of Shangchwan in December 1552. His remains are enshrined in the Church of Good Jesus in Goa.

This Saturday is the feast day of **St Nicholas**. Historically, we know only that Nicholas was a fourth-century bishop of Myra in Asia Minor. We are can perhaps best capture Nicholas's character through the stories told about him. In the best-known one Nicholas secretly tossed a bag of gold through a poor man's window on three occasions to provide dowries for this daughters. Over time, this legend evolved into the custom of gift-giving on the saint's feast.

Prayer for the First Sunday of Advent

Grant, almighty Father, that when Christ comes again we may go out to meet him bearing the harvest of good works achieved by your grace. We pray that he will receive us into the company of the saints and call us into the kingdom of heaven.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen**
