

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

In much of Catholic Europe the Epiphany is the time for giving presents, for reasons which must surely be obvious. We too could give presents to each other! Gold is easy: give some gold, some jewellery, or to the children a gold one- or two- pound coin, or gold-covered chocolate money. Frankincense has to have something to do with God, with worship ("Let my prayer. O Lord, rise like incense before You": Psalm 140, 2): a promise of prayers, a prayer-card or prayer book, some book on the faith. Myrrh is also easy on the imagination: it is for preserving the body, so how about soap, scent, after-shave, bubble-bath. And so we celebrate the Epiphany, as always, making something of a great feast and a great event in salvation history (the presentation of Christ to the gentiles) by *doing* something which we will remember. Of course, such a *doing* will speak loudest of all to the children. As a way of doing this, could the children please come dressed as kings on the day (perhaps not camels!), and maybe bring some small gifts to give to needy children at home and abroad. i.e. crayons, pencils, colouring books etc.

Please note - There will be no Masses on Tuesdays and Thursdays until further notice. This is due to a lack of stewards. With the increased risk from the new variant of the virus, cleaning and disinfecting is an even bigger job.
