The English Martyrs


As Sundays take precedence over saints' days, we won't this year be formally celebrating our patronal Feast of the English Martyrs, which falls on Sunday 4 th May (today). On 4 May 1535, at Tyburn in London, there died three Carthusian monks, the first of many Roman Catholic martyrs of the English Reformation and its aftermath in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries. Of these, forty-two have been canonised and a further 242 have been declared Blessed. But the true number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison or were tortured or persecuted for their faith cannot be reckoned. The persecution lasted for around 150 years. The martyrs we honour on this day came from every walk of life. There were rich and poor, men and women, married and single. They are remembered for their example of constancy in their faith and courage in the face of persecution.

His Holiness Pope Francis RIP

"Build bridges, not walls" was an exhortation he repeated many times, and his service of faith as Successor of the Apostle Peter always was linked to the service of humanity in all its dimensions. Spiritually united with all of Christianity, we are here in large numbers to pray for Pope Francis, that God may welcome him into the immensity of his love.

Pope Francis used to conclude his speeches and meetings by saying, "Do not forget to pray for me."

Dear Pope Francis, we now ask you to pray for us. May you bless the Church, bless Rome, and bless the whole world from heaven as you did last Sunday from the balcony of this Basilica in a final embrace with all the people of God, but also embrace humanity that seeks the truth with a sincere heart and holds high the torch of hope."
