The Feast of the Ascension

This Thursday we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord's Ascension to heaven, the culmination of Jesus's life on earth and the start of the Church's mission.

On this **Holy Day of Obligation** the Liturgy of the Word begins with the first chapter of The Acts of the Apostles, the book generally acknowledged as having been written by St Luke as a continuation of his Gospel. Luke summarises the conversations of Jesus with the apostles during the forty days after his resurrection, followed by a final appearance during which he promises to send them the Holy Spirit, a power that will enable them to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth.

The Acts passage concludes with the description of the Ascension with which we are more familiar - through works of art - than the more understated descriptions we find in the Gospels. In this liturgical year B we hear the conclusion of Mark's Gospel, with the apostles "going out and preaching everywhere, the Lord working with them..."

In all this, we shouldn't overlook the words of St Paul in the 2nd Reading. Paul expresses the theological meaning of the feast: God has glorified Jesus, raising above all earthly powers, and making him Lord of all creation. Paul writes about the consequences of this for Christians, of the hope that the Ascension holds out for us. We are destined to share in the glory of Jesus.

May is the Month of Mary

The Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. The month of May is always part of the Easter season, the fifty days we celebrate in the liturgy the Resurrection of Our Lord, a time also of awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The celebration of May as a Marian month fits well with the liturgical celebrations of Easter and Pentecost as we recall Mary's great joy in her Son's victory over death as well as her presence with the apostles in the upper room prayerfully awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.



Prayer for Ascension Thursday Lord Jesus,

You who in your ascension filled the Eleven with joy, make us worthy of that same joy through your prayer and your mercy. Lord Jesus, You who in your ascension bore our fragile humanity into heaven and opened for us the way that leads to Heaven, fill us with the joy of serenity and peace. Lord Jesus, You who by ascending into heaven clothed us with the gift of the Holy Spirit, make us your witnesses in our daily lives telling of the joy of your Mercy.
