The Glory Be's remind us that the purpose of all life is the glory of the Trinity.

This Tuesday, 7 October, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Feast was established by Pope Pius V in 1573 to thank God for an important Christian victory over the Turks at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571 - a victory attributed to the praying of the rosary. Clement XI extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716.

This Thursday is the Feast of St John Henry Newman. He was ordained Anglican priest in 1825. but prayer and reflection subsequently led him to be received into the Catholic Church. He became an influential religious leader and was instrumental in the foundation of the Catholic University of Ireland, which, in time, evolved into University College Dublin. Elevated to the rank of Cardinal in 1879, he died in 1890. As a result of two miraculous cures attributed to his intercession, he was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009 and canonised by Pope Francis in October 2019.
