Father Clement will say mass on Monday at 10.00am preceded by the Holy Rosary at 9.45am, so as many as possible can participate in this action, calling for the gift of peace wherever there is conflict.

NOVEMBER is the month when we pray for the dead. Our <u>faith</u> in the resurrection encourages us to pray <u>in hope</u> for the forgiveness of their sins and the <u>gift</u> of eternal life. Each parish community brings this prayer together for all its relatives, friends and benefactors in Masses (*the Dead List*) offered throughout the year. If you would like your family and relatives to be included there are forms in church for the November Dead List. Please take one and fill it in with the <u>SURNAME(S)</u> of the family(ies) you would like remembered. (*Please note, these people will be remembered <u>collectively</u> in Masses that are for the dead list. They will <u>NOT</u> be said individually.)*

New Missals - As you know the Bishops of England and Wales have decided on a new translation of the Bible readings we listen to every week. The new lectionaries will be in use from the First Sunday of Advent. This also means the readings in your Sunday missals will be different. If anyone would like to purchase a new missal they are available from CTS (Catholic Truth Society), alternatively, I can place a bulk order for anyone wishing to buy one. There are three options available:

A standard edition in red hardback with 2 ribbons - £19.95. A red paperback version which lasts just for the year from Advent to Christ the King 2025 - £9.95 and a gilt-edged, burgundy bonded leather missal with two ribbons and a slipcase - £29.95. If anyone would like to order one please let me know asap. I will need to place the order quickly to have them in time for Advent.

Homelessness Sunday (today) This weekend Christian churches in England and Wales mark Homelessness Sunday. Housing Justice, the influential ecumenical housing charity (whose president is Cardinal Vincent Nichols) reports that "Homelessness Sunday is more important than ever this year with homelessness charities across the board seeing dramatically increased demand for their services. Housing Justice is no different, with demand at the highest levels experienced in the 70 years since Housing Justice and its heritage organisations were founded." In his reflection for Homelessness Sunday, Housing Justice Trustee, Bishop John Davies, former Anglican Archbishop of Wales, writes:

The homeless are vulnerable, but too conveniently and wrongly blamed for their situation. They're too easily seen as nuisances, valueless, a drain. But would Jesus treat them as such? Never! He would assert that they are entitled to trust that they will be welcomed, nurtured, supported and given the chance to flourish, a chance all too easily taken for granted. And, whether you are a Christian or not, to say 'No' to this is to deny the homeless the basic human right to be treated justly, to be dealt with compassionately and to be afforded a welcome." This Wednesday we celebrate the Feast of St John Henry Newman.

Born in London in 1801, he was ordained Anglican priest in 1825. A prominent member of the Oxford Movement which sought to bring the Church of England back to its roots, his studies, prayers and reflections eventually persuaded him to be received into the Catholic Church.

Ordained Catholic priest, he became an influential religious leader and was instrumental in the foundation of the Catholic University of Ireland, which, in time, evolved into University College Dublin.

Newman was elevated to the rank of Cardinal in 1879 in recognition of his services to the Catholic Church in England. He died of pneumonia in 1890.

In 1991, after a thorough examination of Newman's life and work, Pope John Paul II proclaimed him Venerable. Following two miraculous cures attributed to his intercession, he was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on his visit to the UK in 2009 and canonised by Pope Francis in October 2019.
