Feast of the Annunciation of Lord tomorrow. There will be a Mass at Meadowhead this Monday morning at 10.00am on the Feast (Solemnity) of the Annunciation of the Lord. The feast could not be celebrated on its usual date this year as the 25th March fell in Holy Week. When this occurs, it is transferred to the first available date after the Easter Octave.

Please come along if you can to give thanks for the mystery of the Incarnation, God has become one of us. The Rosary will be prayed before Mass.

There will be an appeal and retiring collection at Masses this weekend for Survive-Miva, a Catholic lay association providing funding for essential transport for health outreach work and pastoral care in isolated rural areas, and in places of difficult access, across Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Offertory Envelopes for the coming year are available at the back of both churches.

Mass settings
Noise We are trying to coordinate the Mass settings at 9.15 and 11.15 Mass and have appropriate Mass settings for different seasons on the Church's year. We also need the settings to be suitable for the music group or the organ.

The new hymnbook means we have a choice of Mass settings usually with one line of music. For Easter and Low Sunday we are going to use the Creation Mass. After that we will introduce the Mass of Christ the Saviour by Daniel L. Schutte. This will be done gradually starting with the Holy, Holy and Memorial Acclamation, then the Lamb of God and Gloria. For the other parts of the Mass we will continue to use the Creation Mass setting.


We are in DESPERATE need of more CHURCH CLEANERS.

If you do not possess a badge but need to park, please consider applying for one.








Mass Setting Easter Sunday and Low Sunday





We proclaim that the tomb is empty. Yes, death is all around us, but life is in Christ. This is his gift to us, making clear that we are of God and in him we will attain the fullness of life for which we long.

This breaking of the claims of death opens a new and wonderful horizon by which we are now to live. In the days of his life on earth, Jesus spelt out the lessons of this true way of life. They can be summed up in two words: service and sacrifice. This is the pathway to greatness, unfolded by Jesus in the washing of the feet and the offering of himself on the Cross. This, then, is the royal road: to live in love through the practical service of one another and, at crucial moments, to be forgetful of self. This is our Easter message. We pray for this spirit of service and sacrifice to be poured out in our world, that we can work together wholeheartedly for the relief of stark poverty, for peace between warring factions, for stability in home and society.
