Thought for the Week

"But when he (John the Baptist) saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees to his baptism he said to them, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father", for I tell you, God is able to raise up from these stones children for Abraham. Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire" (Matthew 3:7-10)

This warning, against complacent confidence in self-assumed righteousness speaks to us as well as to the Pharisees and Sadducees. **Are** *we* producing "the appropriate fruit" - or are we just coasting complacently along?
