#### The Bethlehem Ball 23rd November, 2024

It is 10 years since we held the first Hallam Dinner and Dance

to raise funds for a hospice service in Betlehem. After long preparation, planning and fundraising, on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2023 the Trust opened the first licensed specialist palliative care service in Palestine. Since then it's nurses have made over 1,000 home visits to care for over 90 patients. This includes 2 children. There is a waiting list of people needing care.





This year we want to celebrate the Charity's success and at the same time help these nurses to continue caring for the terminally ill and their families. Unfortunately, we had to take a long break due to Covid, so the funds to maintain this service have diminished significantly. #### **TODAY, SUNDAY 7TH JULY - PADLEY PILGRIMAGE**

Annual Pilgrim Walk from Totley to Padley Chapel Shrine on Sunday July 7th - starting from English Martyrs Carpark, Totley at 11am (Walk approx 3 hours)

David & Anne-Marie Fletcher, parishioners at English Martyrs Totley, are inviting anyone who wishes to join them in a 6 mile pilgrim walk (with picnic lunch stop at Longshaw). Starting point is from English Martyrs Church Carpark S174DF- through Totley Bents & across Blackamoor - descending to Padley Gorge and finishing at Padley at approx 2pm.

Wear walking boots as terrain is good but not smooth and bring waterproofs just in case; Bring water and pack up lunch. The walk would not be suitable for those with walking difficulties but some may wish to join us at Longshaw Cafe lunch stop. We aim to be at Padley Chapel grounds with plenty of time to rest before the 3pm procession from Grindleford Station & 3.30pm Outdoor Catholic Mass honouring the Padley Priest Martyrs who were captured at Padley in July 1588.

There are toilets at English Martyrs Church, Fox House, Longshaw Cafe & Grindleford Cafe. There will be portaloos at Padley. Return either by foot; by train from Grindleford station or possibility of car lift. #### The Most Precious Blood of Jesus

Between 1849 and 1969 the Feast of the Most Precious Blood of Christ was celebrated on the first Sunday of July. The feast itself was removed from the general Roman calendar by Pope Paul VI because Christ's Blood is venerated through the feasts of Corpus Christi, the Sacred Heart, and the Exaltation of the Cross. But the month of July is still dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus.

The devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood. "The Precious Blood we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

This Thursday we celebrate the **feast day of** Saint Benedict of Nursia. Born in 480, Benedict abandoned his studies in Rome and lived for three years as a hermit in a cave high in the mountains before being drawn towards a communal form of monasticism. He organised communities of monks and nuns, including the great monastery of Monte Cassino. He drew up a set of rules to guide their communal life. The Rule of St Benedict has proved so wise and balanced that it has served as the foundation of many other attempts at communal living - and not only in religious communities. The Rule recognises that people aim at perfection but often fall well short of it, and aims to be a "rule for beginners" in which even the least perfect and least able can grow in spiritual stature.

#### A prayer of St Benedict

(Feast Day this Thursday)

Gracious and Holy Father, give us the wisdom to perceive You, the intelligence to understand You, the diligence to seek You, the patience to wait for You, eyes to behold You, a heart to meditate upon You, and a life to proclaim You, through the power of the Spirit of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
