Day for Life next Sunday. The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. In England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. This year it falls on 16 **June**. The theme is *The Lord is my Shepherd – Compassion and Hope at the End of Life*.

A debate on end-of-life issues has been in the headlines in recent months with calls for assisted suicide being expressed, especially by celebrities, a view that opposes the Catholic view that life is a gift and that we are called to care for others at the end of their lives.

This Thursday13 June, we celebrate the feast of St Anthony of Padua. Born in Lisbon in 1195, Anthony joined the Augustinians in Lisbon, giving up a future of wealth and power. Later when five Franciscans were martyred, he was inspired to enter the Franciscan Order. Years of searching for Jesus in prayer, of reading Scripture and of serving in poverty and obedience prepared Anthony to allow the Spirit to use his talents. He became an outstanding preacher and theologian, leading the friars in Northern Italy for three years, and later preaching in Southern France, then a stronghold of the Albigensian heresy. He is the patron saint of Lisbon, lost items and poor people (to name just three from a long list of causes)
